FROM THE DEAN

Dear Friends in Christ,

A new year of Grace has begun, filled with light and hope. Through the mission of the Cathedral, the light and hope of Jesus Christ is experienced by a multitude of people.

For example, in the busy month of December, souls were fed through the offering of the Holy Eucharist eight times over six days every week, through concerts offered by the Kansas City Symphony Chorus, the William Baker Festival Singers, and the annual Messiah Sing-along. The Collegium Vocale from the UMKC Conservatory of Music offered Lessons and Carols for Advent followed the next day by William Jewell College's annual Christmas concert *The City Come Again. The Nativity* by the Paul Mesner Puppets was sold out for all of their performances, and the final performance played host to several hundred guests from The Crittenden Children's Center who enjoyed a Christmas party and visit with Santa in Founders' Hall sponsored by the Cathedral's Foster Care Group and volunteers. December 24 the Kansas City Community Kitchen moved into the upstairs of Founders' Hall to serve over 500 festive holiday meals. A few days before Christmas the Tallis Singers shared tidings of joy with residents of Bishop Spencer Place, and on Christmas Eve the Birth of Christ was told in a very special way by our young people. The Holy Eucharist was taken to those homebound and in care facilities and hospitals, and in many other ways, the love of Christ was shared. The Word was made Flesh in Bethlehem, and the Incarnate Lord continues to be shared through our common ministry at Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral.

The new year begins with financial challenges for virtually everyone and every organization. The Cathedral's endowment and trust funds will produce approximately \$140,000 less in 2009, and with pledges and plate offerings expected to be less as well, the working draft of the 2009 operating budget will anticipate at least \$200,000 less income. The Budget Committee will present a proposed budget to the Vestry in January, and the approved budget will be presented at the January 25 Annual Meeting.

As the Treasurer's Report on page 2 indicates, through November income and expenses are running close to budget. Throughout 2008 the Budget Committee and Vestry

worked diligently to keep income and expenses in line, and the Cathedral staff along with lay leaders who have oversight over budget items are to be greatly commended for their stewardship and management of resources while maintaining vital programs and ministries.

The Cathedral's budget is actually a detailed plan for how we will carry out Christ's work in the coming months. Every expense is related in some way to ministry, and income lines represent resources committed to our many aspects of ministry. As we seek to do the work of the Gospel in the new year, the gifts and talents of each Cathedral member are needed to help our ministry grow stronger. Thank you to those who have made a financial pledge for 2009. If you are planning to make a financial commitment soon, know that your support will make a difference. For some in our parish community at this time, it appears unlikely that they can make a pledge this year. Know that you are not alone, and that by your prayers and continued participation in worship and the ongoing life of the parish you are very much a part of the Cathedral community. And finally, if you find that you are in a position to make a financial pledge for the first time, or increase your pledge at any point in 2009, your offering will be so very much appreciated. A pledge can be made at any time, and can be revised at any point, by leaving a pledge card in the offering plate, going online to www.ghtc-kc.org/stewardship, or by calling the office and speaking with Financial Administrator David Stoll.

Understanding Israel's Exile

O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lonely exile...

Arguably, the two seminal events in Israel's history as a nation were the Exodus and the Exile. The Exodus is recounted in the second book of the Bible, as well as reinterpreted in portions of Numbers and Deuteronomy. It is the story of God leading God's chosen people from bondage in Egypt to the Land of Promise, and the giving of the Covenant. By contrast, the Exile represents the complete reversal of Israel's fortune: loss of land, destruction of Temple, and removal of God's favor. It was the worst national crisis that Israel underwent, but it also laid the foundation for its most sweeping renewal. The birth of Christianity and the rise of rabbinic Judaism are both related to the political and theological consequences of the Exile.

Old Testament Scripture interpreted the Exile in a variety of ways: as a lost opportunity, as punishment for sin with the possibility of redemption, as an utter calamity for nationhood, and as a Sabbath for the Land. Join Canon Sue Sommer as together we will examine those themes and reflect on their impact both for the Jewish world and for emerging Christianity. If time permits, we'll consider the impact of the Exile on the current state of Israel.
