


Packets of zinnia seeds are given to all who worship with us today. In honor of Mother's Day, we suggest any of the following:

- Plant them in remembrance of the mother who gave you life.
- Give them to a child along with a small pot and a bit of soil, and give thanks for the women who nurtured you.
- Save them for a special occasion and give thanks for moms everywhere who graciously accept gifts of all kinds.

The seeds given today are Cut & Come Again Zinnias. Cut these old-fashioned blooms for your bouquets, and flowers will "come again," producing continuously until fall frost. Long-lasting 2–2½" blossoms on heat-loving plants supply endless color for your flower beds, containers and borders. Each individual flowers lasts a very long time on the plant, and in the vase before fading. Zinnias seem to be a favorite of butterflies, and many gardeners add zinnias specifically to attract them.







Communion


For a blessing, cross your hands over your chest.
