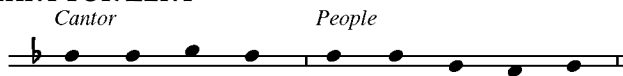

I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

The Presider then addresses the sponsors

The sponsors places a hand upon the shoulder of those they are sponsoring, while the Presider extends a hand toward them and says
May Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who has put the desire into your hearts to seek the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, grant you the power of the Holy Spirit to persevere in this intention and to grow in faith and understanding.

The Presider asks the sponsors and congregation

Do you approve the enrolling of these catechumens as candidates for these rites?

The Presider then says

In the Name of God, and with the consent of this congregation,
I accept you as candidates for these rites and direct that your names be written in this book.
God grant that all our names be written in the Book of Life.

The candidates then publicly write their names in the book.

The candidates remain at the base of the steps leading to the font for the prayer.

We pray for these your servants who desire the grace and strengthening of the Holy Spirit in the rites of Confirmation and Reaffirmation. Give now, we pray, to those who ask, let those who seek find and open the gate to those who knock; that they may receive your blessing, and come to that promised kingdom which you have prepared, and where you live and reign for ever and ever.

Perennial Pilgrims: Making the Trip through Holy Week

We are invited annually to hear and experience the story of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. You are invited to come and get ready for the journey during the Sundays of Lent. The travel log of Egeria, a woman who visited the Holy Land in the late fourth century, as well as the Book of Common Prayer will serve as guides for our preparation.

We will use Egeria's writings, Scripture, and church tradition as springboards from which to understand our own experience of Palm Sunday, Holy Week, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter at the Cathedral. The question, "What does this mean for us?" will be a constant theme preparing and propelling us forward as people of faith.

The goal of our time together is to share together the actual pilgrimage of Holy Week and Easter. This class will be led by Dean Peter DeVeau, assisted by others.
