For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.
	On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

A very special thank you to all the members of the congregation who donated food during the Lenten Season. Outreach collected almost 700 pounds of food for St. Mary's Pantry from the congregation. Some of the donated food included: 113 cans of Soup/Chili, 61 jars of Peanut Butter, 197 boxes of Macaroni and Cheese, and 187 cans of Canned Meat. The Cathedral's yearly goal is to donate 2 tons of food to St. Mary's. At the end of the first quarter we have reached 26% of our yearly goal.
