FROM THE DEAN “Walkable” Faith

Walkability! It’s a “buzzword” for our times. People are moving into neighborhoods in cities that are “walkable.” While “walkable” is a word the spell-check on my computer tells me is not a word, it is a hot topic concept across the country. More and more people, especially young adults, want to live in communities where they can walk to work, shop, access entertainment, recreate and ride decent public transportation.

Having what one needs close at hand in order to lead a satisfying, balanced, and productive life is sensible. One sees so much more on foot than speeding by in a car. Fewer resources are used and there is more time to spare. There is time to engage in a community. This desire for walkability is part of what is fueling and sustaining the Downtown-Crossroads renaissance in Kansas City.

Walkability has been around for a long time. It’s been the preferred arrangement for cities and communities. I’d like to suggest that when the church gathers to keep the ancient rites of Holy Week and Easter, we celebrate a “walkable” faith. We speak of “the journey of faith,” the “Way of the Cross,” the “Road to Emmaus.” We walk with Christ in the way of his suffering. We die with Christ. We rise with Christ in newness of life.

This Holy Week and Easter I invite you to enter the walkable neighborhood that is Christian faith. Be present for services as you are able. Everything one needs for a balanced, meaningful and authentic life is there for each of us.

Treasurer's Report

The Cathedral is off to a good financial start to 2015 as pledge receipts were stronger early this year than in early 2014. In addition, while expenses in the first two months were modestly higher than last year, this is primarily due to the timing of payments made for property maintenance.

As an example, while this year the bills for snow removal are arriving promptly, some of the snow removal bills last year did not arrive until springtime. All in all, the combined effect of the better income and good expense controls is a narrower deficit vs. last year.

Certainly, timely payment of pledges is one way to help the Cathedral in its ministry. Parishioners who have not yet done so are asked to prayerfully consider making a pledge.

Following Jesus' call to love one another, GHTC is deeply committed to caring for others, especially during times of uncertainty, transition or crisis. Through our Pastoral Care Ministry, also called *Cathedral Caregivers*, we partner with God and each other to provide confidential care for parishioners and friends of the Cathedral in varying circumstances.

The pastoral care team and our clergy work to address concerns in a number of ways. Included in this growing ministry are home and hospital visits, Communion visits, prayer shawl and prayer ministries, flower and meal deliveries during illness or crisis, transportation assistance to medical appointments and assistance in making minor home repairs.

Weekdays of Holy Week: March 30-April 1

Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday

12:05 p.m. & 5:30 p.m. Eucharist

The gospel lessons for each day center on Jesus' movement toward his suffering, death and resurrection.

The Three Days · *The Sacred Triduum*

Maundy Thursday, April 2

12:05 p.m., A simple Eucharist

6 p.m., Maundy Thursday Liturgy

The 6 p.m. service, which includes supper, begins in Founders' Hall.

We remember Jesus' last meal with his disciples by listening to the gospel, washing feet as a sign of servant ministry, sharing the bread and wine of Eucharist and eating an agape meal together. We process to the Cathedral to sing, pray and witness the stripping of the altar. Spiritual direction and reconciliation (confession) are available following the service. The Cathedral is open for prayer until 9 p.m. *Nursery open for children three and younger.*

Good Friday, April 3

12:05 p.m. & 7 p.m. Good Friday Liturgy

The service includes the singing of the Passion according to John, choral and instrumental music, familiar hymns, customary prayers and veneration of the cross of Christ. *Nursery open for children three and younger by reservation only (childrensformation@kccathedral.org, 816-474-8260).*

2:30 & 5 p.m. Walk the Way of the Cross

The Way of the Cross is a devotional prayer to help us recall Jesus' journey to the cross. This year, crosses decorated by our children will be used to mark the final steps of Jesus. We begin in the Nave. This devotional prayer is appropriate for all ages. Join us to walk and pray the Way of the cross.

Holy Saturday, April 4

12:05 p.m. Liturgy

This brief and simplest of all liturgies recalls the mournful desolation of the lifeless Christ in the tomb.

Parking passes that allow you to exit the garage without paying are available from the ushers.

Celebrating the Resurrection

Easter Eve, April 4

7:30 p.m. The Great Vigil of Easter

This service of Light, Lessons, Christian Initiation and Eucharist is the principal service of the Church Year. The Bishop presides at this first celebration of Easter. *Nursery open for children three and younger by reservation only (childrensformation@kccathedral.org, 816-474-8260).*

The congregation gathers in Founders' Hall prior to the lighting of the new fire in the Memorial Courtyard. All then move to the darkened Cathedral nave as the service continues. We celebrate the affirmation of baptism with those who have taken part in The Way. A festive reception follows the service in Founders' Hall.

Easter Day, April 5

8 a.m. and 10:15 a.m. Festival Holy Eucharist

Hymns, choral music, brass and a Cathedral resplendent with flowers accompany our Easter morning celebrations. Children uncover the "Alleluia" buried away at the end of Epiphany as a prelude to the entire assembly acclaiming, "Alleluia. Christ is risen." *Nursery open for children three and younger during the 8 & 10:15 a.m. services. Children's Chapel begins after the Collect of the Day.*

Festive receptions follow each service.

An Easter Egg Hunt for children (through fifth grade) follows the 10:15 a.m. service.

- Episcopal Relief Development International, offering maternal and child health to eradicate preventable deaths.
