CONVERSATION

A Message from Father James

As Mary Jane and I begin our time with you, I have asked that opportunities be given for us to have conversation with you in small group settings. In those times I want to put names with faces, but even more importantly I want to hear from you about the Cathedral and its ministries, your hopes and dreams, your concerns and fears. I will be listening intentionally for those issues that you know about and I need to learn about. Most of all, my hope is that we participate together as a community centered in the Spirit of Jesus Christ.

One of the issues that always comes up has to do with the nature of interim work. First, the work of the priest who agrees to come for a limited time is virtually the same as it is for one who agrees to come for a lifetime. One must still meet you, the people of God, assess the needs of the congregation, address them, and leave. Whether that is done in the span of 18 months or 18 years, the steps are similar. Second, my work during interim times is not intended



to be a holding action. It is meant to move the congregation forward in its ministry, its stewardship, its fellowship, and its administration. While the aforementioned areas are not inclusive, they are suggestive of my meaning. Third, there is no reason to not keep right on growing in terms of our engagement spiritually and behaviorally. During this next 18 months your life will not go on hold, and that goes for the city as well. The very nature of interim ministry is that you will continue to reach out, continue to grow, and that you will have capable, experienced leadership as you do. I trust that I will be able to measure up to that expectation in many areas.

It has been suggested by the Gallup organization that congregational engagement and spiritual commitment are the two mainstays of congregational spiritual health, and that there are four measures of congregational effectiveness in leading to those mainstays:

- Serving and helping others;
- inviting others to participate;
- financial support; and
- life satisfaction.

The engagement factor might be summed up in a few questions. I am going to suggest four questions for your reflection. As a help to me to understand the nature of the Cathedral's present effectiveness, I invite you to write to me or to attend one of the conversation groups and give your responses to these questions. They will be for me a listening post, a beginning, if you will, to understand the nature of my work while in this wonderful cathedral parish.

- + Are you reaching out to others in service?
- + Have you recently invited someone to join with you in coming to the Cathedral?
- ⁺ Is your support of the Cathedral a matter of generosity and spiritual growth?
- + Are you challenged and affirmed on some regular basis by someone at the Cathedral?

These questions should be sufficient to begin our conversation, though any topic will be fair game as grist for our dialogue. Mary Jane and I look forward to our time with you, and pray with you God's blessings on the lives and ministries of all who call Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral home.

The Two Cathedrals of Kansas City

The photograph above shows Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral through the new rose window opening of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, and demonstrates the physical closeness of the two cathedrals in downtown Kansas City. The relationship involves a lot more than proximity, as the cathedrals entered into a Covenant in 1974 and have a strong history of working together over the years.

More than 12,000 people contributed over \$7 million for the current renovation project at Immaculate Conception. The building has been completely redone inside and out, and tours during construction attest to the classical beauty that has been returned to the cathedral of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. The new rose window has not been installed, making the November 2002 view in the photo a piece of history.

Current plans target Saturday, Febtruary 22, 2003 for the Mass of Dedication of the renovated Cathedral. More detail on the rebuilding can be found at:

Absalom Jones Diocesan Service on February 8, 2003

On Saturday, February 8, 2003, the Diocese of Western Missouri will celebrate the Feast Day of Absalom Jones. Bishop Barry Howe will be the celebrant at the Eucharist service, to be held at 11:00 a.m. at Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral.

Absalom Jones was the first African American priest in the Episcopal Church, ordained in Philadelphia on September 21, 1802. He was born a slave in 1746 in Deleware and was sold to a store owner in Philadelphia. He taught himself to read from the New Testament, attended a night school for blacks operated by the Quakers, and eventually bought his own freedom and that of his wife.

Jones became an active member of St. George's Methodist Episcopal Church, where he served as lay minister for its black membership. As <u>Lesser Feasts and Fasts</u> (from which this article is drawn) puts it: "The active evangelism of Jones and that of his friend Richard Allen greatly increased membership at St. George's." This alarmed the vestry, which decided to segregate blacks to an upstairs gallery. Jones and Allen were outraged when this was announced at the next service, and led the black parishioners out the door.

Absalom Jones and Richard Allen organized the free African Society in 1787, and it began to build a church in 1792. In October 1794, St. Thomas African Episcopal Church was admitted to the Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania. The walk out from St. George's had a second powerful result: Richard Allen and others in the Free African Society with a preference for Methodism founded the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church, and Allen was named the first bishop of the AME church



in 1816. Absalom Jones became the Rector of St. Thomas and was known as the Black Bishop of the Episcopal Church. He continued to preach on behalf of the oppressed and distressed until his death in 1818.

The feast day for Absalom Jones is February 13th, celebrated this year on February 8th. The service is organized by St. Augustine of Hippo Episcopal Church (Fr. Thomas Shepherd, Rector), located on Benton Boulevard. Members of St. Augustine have assembled an excellent series of displays on African American history that can be seen at the reception following the February 8th service, and will be at the Cathedral the prior week.
