## Annual Meeting a Time for Review, Looking Forward

On Sunday, January 18, the annual meeting was called to order. We began with a prayer, and Tom Miller was recognized for chairing the nominating committee.

"It's a wonderful opportunity to serve all of you," Miller said. "It was interesting and exciting."

Nominations from the floor included Donna Knoell and Hal Smith, and members from the previous year were acknowledged.

Father James spoke about the new dean as being one who would "carry on this great vision."

Many stood up to recognize James Hubbard for his time at the cathedral.

Michael Thomas spoke about the financial annual report in detail (please see the exact figures in the annual report pamphlet on pages 30 to 36). There has been some reduction in pledges and "2001 and 2002 were pretty grim" as far as the money market went, he said.

However, Thomas said adjustments have been made to eliminate certain positions such as an open sexton position and a nursery position, and a reduction has been made in the music department. Upon seeing the unhappy faces, he remarked, "I know I don't need to remind you, but I'm merely the messenger here."

Thomas praised David Stoll for making the numbers match, as well as Virgil for his hard work around the Cathedral.

A number of organizations were not funded this year because of a surplus exceed-

ing what they have spent. This includes the Altar Guild and the Cathedral Bookstore. Our diocesan contribution actually increased, and this is due to the fact that many missions and parishes throughout the nation need our help.

Although the numbers are dismal, Thomas said, "There is so many ways that the church touches lives." Sometimes, the budget can be messy, but "we have so many people involved in the ministries in this place."

Thomas urged the congregation to get their concerns to the newly elected vestry. "You can shape the ministry priorities of the Cathedral," he said. Upon closing, Thomas received a standing ovation for his work "full of integrity."

Albert Mauro recognized Father James for his leadership as well as Dick Fanolio and Michael

Thomas. Candy McDowell followed with a report from the dean's selection committee.

"I'm here to proclaim good news," she said. McDowell described that the committee is in the interviewing candidates phase, and she listed interesting statistics about each person being considered, from various backgrounds to religious affiliations to occupations.

John Hornbeck spoke about the Outreach program and the plans to continue with their projects as well as participating more in the Harmony House. Their main purpose is that they "want to get you all involved."

Lastly, the vestry candidates were selected: Albert Mauro for a one-year term; Lucy Richards, Marnell Sparks, Doyle White, A. Rodger Wright, Gary Hicks, John Hornbeck and David Rice for three-year terms.


Also within the bright red bags is a plethora of


