What makes us a cathedral?

Bishop Howe visits Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral Sunday, June 13

Our Bishop makes his final Episcopal Visitation on Sunday June 13. Bishop Howe will preach and celebrate the Holy Eucharist at 8 a.m. and 10:15 a.m. After both liturgies there will be an opportunity to greet the Bishop and Mary. Several years ago I approached the Bishop about

including the Cathedral on his regular visitation schedule. While we are privileged to welcome the Bishop for the Paschal Triduum and Christmas Eve, those times do not generally provide opportunities for many of us to share a cup of coffee or have a chat with our chief priest and pastor.

We are titled a "cathedral church" because the *cathedra*, the bishop's throne or chair is here. Though we often place emphasis on the Episcopal headgear, the *mitre*, and the *Crozier*, the pastoral shepherd's staff, the *cathedra* is an important symbol of the Episcopal office. In the first centuries of the church's life, the bishop preached and taught while sitting in that chair. From that chair, today our shepherd shares with us the riches of God's grace, presides over the worship of God the Holy Trinity, and celebrates the

Sacraments of the New Covenant. From that chair, the bishop boldly proclaims and interprets the Gospel of Christ, enlightening the minds and stirring up the consciences of all the baptized people of God. From that Episcopal chair, our chief priest and pastor encourages us and supports us,

lay and ordained, in our various ministries, and prays for us without ceasing.

The *cathedra* also calls us to carry out these same ministries, to build up faith in parishioners, in the members of our diocese, and indeed for the sake of all people. The chair challenges us to extend respect and dignity to all, to be a house of prayer for all people.

Bishop Barry and Mary Howe have been, and continue to be for us, vessels of God's grace. This visit is not a time to say adieu; that bittersweet time is several months away. But there is no time like the present to say "thank you" for all they have taught us of God's love.

# Dean's Cup Classic to support Culinary Cornerstones

The evening begins with appetizers and the opening of the silent auction at 5:30 p.m. The banquet with the awards presentation begins at 6:30 p.m. The banquet will give you the opportunity to see Culinary Cornerstones students in action. Additional tickets to the banquet are available for just \$25.

Silent auction items can be previewed Sundays during coffee hour. The auction will close near the end of the banquet.



Looking for some stories-with-a-lesson to share with a child this summer? In June, we're bringing in the Berenstain Bears Living Lights  $^{\text{TM}}$  books, which are faith-based and fun! Yes, these are the

same bears who emerged from deep in Bear Country in 1962! Stan and Jan Berenstain published their first book about everyday family experiences at that time and continued to entertain and delight children through the years. Their youngest son, Michael Berenstain, published his first children's book years before he joined his parents in the late 1980's as a writer and illustrator. After his father's death in 2005, Michael and his mother,



Jan, continued to work together on creating and publishing stories about wise Mama and Papa and the Bear family.

Although the everyday experiences of the Bear family continues to be published, this additional series, Bears Living Lights ™, helps children learn how God wants them to live every day. These books begin with a Bible verse and the story unfolds with a scripture-based lesson. When the Bear family practices going to church, praying, being kind, and remembering how much God loves them, their lives are much more joyful. Most of the stories are recommended for ages 4-7, although independent readers love them, too!

Here is a sampling of titles to look for this summer in our bookstore:

- The Berenstain Bears and the Golden Rule: Children learn how choosing to be kind may not always be the easy choice, but it is always the right one.
- The Berenstain Bears Play a Good Game: Children learn important lessons about fair play and sportsmanship for both players and coaches. They discover that they should always act in a way that pleases God.
- The Berenstain Bears Say Their Prayers:
   Brother Bear discovers that God answers every prayer in His own way and time. Praying isn't just for bedtime!
