Bittersweet moment for Cathedral

Dear friends,

It was a bittersweet moment for Cathedral parishioners on June 5 when Dean Terry White was elected bishop of Kentucky. We will miss him ... and at the same time we are pleased that the leadership gifts we've seen so clearly in him have been affirmed by others throughout the Church. Certainly we can take pride in the fact that his gifts for the episcopacy were honed here at Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral.

When a parish priest is elected bishop, it is customary for that priest's parish and for the electing diocese to present the new bishop with symbols of the office at the new bishop's consecration. These symbols include pectoral cross, ring, mitre and crossier. In addition, there is a host of new vestments that bishops alone wear, all of which must be purchased.

We have learned that the Diocese of Kentucky will present Bishop-elect White with a ring, crosier and a chasuble-cope-stole-mitre set. The GHTC Transition Committee proposes to commission a Celtic pectoral cross to be made for him, and is currently researching local artists who could make one in time for his September 25 consecration. Terry specifically mentioned a Celtic pectoral cross as one item that would be especially meaningful to him. As you know,

bishops traditionally wear a pectoral cross whenever they wear their clericals as well as when they wear liturgical vestments. Terry would literally be wearing a gift from Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral on his heart.

Please consider this an invitation to make a financial gift in honor of Terry. Checks may be made payable to Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral; please be sure to note "gift to Terry" on the memo line. Any additional monies, above and beyond the cost of the cross, will be put into a purse to be given to Terry to use as needed. No monies from the operating fund or from the endowment fund will be used.

We are receiving gifts now through July 21, and will make a presentation at his farewell party Friday, July 23. Gifts may be mailed to the Cathedral office, or placed in the offering plates on Sunday. We regret that in this one instance we cannot include your gift on your regular contribution statement; to do so would be to incur a tax liability for Terry, according to the Cathedral's chancellor.

We know you'll want to join us in honoring Dean White. Thank you for your generosity.

For the month of May 2010, the actual results were better than the budgeted amount. Pledges were above budget by approximately \$5,000 and while expenses were about \$2,000 higher than budget the month's results were better than budgeted.

For the year-to-date operating results, revenues were higher than budget due to higher pledges and plate. Additionally, expenses were lower than budget. The continued improvement in pledge income and management of expenditures will be necessary to continue to outperform the budget during the months ahead.

Botswana Palapye Project launched at GHTC

Sunday, June 20, GHTC hosted the launching of the Botswana Palapye Project — a day care center for orphaned and vulnerable children in the Palapye community. The Rev. Canon James Amanze from the Companion Relationship Committee in the Diocese of Botswana was our honored guest for this celebration.

Members of the Diocesan Companion Relationship Committee (of which Dean White is a member) determined that our partnership with Botswana should focus on addressing the needs of orphans and vulnerable children whose only care was being provided by a small Anglican congregation.

To that end, the Diocese will assist in this effort by sponsoring a day care center to address the educational and spiritual needs of these children. This Center is targeted to serve approximately 100 children, with a future goal of developing a full-service community center.

The annual operations of the center are estimated to be \$84,500. This would provide daily care for the orphans and vulnerable children, aged 2-6 years. Classroom lessons, meals and snacks and social activities are essential features of the program. In addition, after school care for primary school age children would include tutoring and other educational opportunities.

The Cathedral is one of several diocesan congregations financially supporting this important ministry.

St. Mary Magdalene Anglican Church of Palapye, Botswana is a humble house of worship filled with bold spirit. Challenging times and limited resources don't stop one member, Joana, from answering the call to share God's Word with a Sunday school of 100+ children. She also works with 2 multi-generation impoverished families to assure their basic needs are met. Join us in aiding this church, Joana, and these orphaned and vulnerable children. The Diocese of West Missouri is partnering with the Diocese of Botswana to build a day care



center to support this community and its families. The companion committees are also working with a local agency to build 2 family homes for the families mentioned above. West Missouri will focus on supplying funds for the daily operations and staffing of the day care and ongoing support for the families in the community.

St. Peter's Day Care Center

St. Peter's has been serving the children of Mogoditshane for 7 years. They started with only 7 children, and now over 90 orphans and vulnerable children receive daily care. In addition, nearly 30 primary school students utilize the center's resources for lessons, homework completion, and afternoon activities. The center is in need of food, educational supplies, bedding, and clothing.
