## FROM THE PRIEST-IN-CHARGE

As I write this column, I am aware of the major transitions going on in the life of the Cathedral and the Diocese. Later this week, I will travel to Louisville to preach at Terry White's Consecration to the episcopacy, and by the time you are reading this, plans will be well underway for the "Walk-About" to meet the candidates for bishop of West Missouri, scheduled at the Cathedral for Sunday, October 17 at 2:30 p.m.

The term, "walkabout" appears to be Australian in origin and refers to the rite of passage of young men, specific young men of the First Nation (Aborigines) who took some time away from their regular village duties to engage a spiritual journey. During this time, they contemplated the sacred stories of their people and imagined their own role as an adult, helping to shape the ongoing tradition of their peoples.

It is also, interestingly enough, a term used colloquially to describe the British Royal Family in their daily duties of walking about, meeting their subjects, visiting people from all walks of life.

And elements of both Australian and British usage seem to fit. The Reverends Casparian, Field and Smith will indeed take time from their regular duties and engage a spiritual journey. It is for all of them a rite of passage, and in particular, for the one whom we ultimately elect as our bishop on November 6. As persons who make themselves available and vulnerable to the Vision of the people of West Missouri, this will be for them an encounter of our sacred stories and it will be our task, as persons who meet them, to help share those stories. And while the days of "Prince Bishops" of the Episcopal Church are behind us, the walk-about will be an opportunity for them to encounter the people of the diocese beyond the Search Committee who definitely represent all walks of life. This event is open to everyone, but it is especially important that delegates to Convention attend as they will be the ones who ultimately will elect.

The Diocesan Convention will be held November 5 and 6 in Kansas City. The business portion of the Convention will take place Friday, November 5 in Bartle Hall; the election will take place Saturday, November 6 in the Cathedral Nave. The celebration of Holy Eucharist will be Saturday morning at 8:45 in the nave. The Eucharist is open to everyone, with clergy and delegates seated toward the front of the nave and guests seated toward the back. There will be a brief recess following the Eucharist, and then voting will begin.

The Diocese of West Missouri assigns the number of lay delegates to a congregation based on their Average Sunday Attendance as reported in the previous year's Parochial Report. (In case you're wondering if there are good reasons apart from your spiritual health for attending church regularly, the answer is yes — our representation at diocesan convention is determined by how many people, on average, worship on Sunday mornings. Just sayin').

Delegates were elected from the Vestry in February of 2010. They are (in alpha order): David Barker, Paula Connors, Adam Duncan, Joe Finnie, Jeff Johnson, Candy McDowell, Angela Michka, Steve Moore, Jim Phillips, David Rice. Should any of the delegates be unable to attend, alternates will be drawn from the following list. (They are listed here in alpha order but will be drawn in the order of the number of votes they received at the February election): Phil Dibble, Charmaine Fowler, Ellen Goheen, Sally Livengood, Christine Morrison, Joyce Morrow, Bob Richmond, Patrick Woolley.

Please keep your clergy and lay delegates in prayer that we may approach this sacred task with humility and wisdom.

The names will be listed in the worship booklet November 7. They will also be entered

Because there are so many unique occasions in October and November, we have decided to postpone the Jazz Liturgy until the middle of the season of Epiphany.



## Children's Formation classes and chapels resume

#### Children's Formation (CF) Classes

Welcome to the new school year! We meet at 9:15 am on Sundays and we would love to have join us. We have classrooms for three year olds through sixth grade. We have some exciting things going on in CF this school year.

We are continuing to use the wonderful Montessori based, *Godly Play* curriculum for the Pre-Kindergarten/Kindergarten (PreK/K) classroom (or the yellow door of Haden Hall). This program encourages children to experience the Bible story being told with beautiful wooden and other natural manipulatives and then allows them to work with these manipulatives as part of the class.

We also have a classroom for our 1st through 3rd graders (the purple door) and another for the 4th through 6th graders (the red door). These classrooms are using the newly-published *Weaving God's Promises* curriculum. This curriculum was written specifically for Episcopal churches by Rev. Canon Joanna Leiserson. (She is the Canon for Christian Formation at Christ Church Cathedral in Cincinnati, Ohio.) According to the program overview, "It's titled *Weaving God's Promises* after the process of faith formation in which we learn how God's promises of salvation are inextricably woven into our lives."

During all of our Formation programs, there is provided a time of feast and fellowship. (We give thanks to God for our blessings prior to our

#### Children's Chapel

We would like to have two chapels! One chapel would be for the little ones (Lambs Chapel) and one for readers and older (Disciples Chapel). We are currently combining the chapels in the Disciples Chapel (orange door) until I have some more wonderful Cathedral volunteers to help out. (Hint, Hint!) Our Chapels meet in Haden Hall at 10:15 am. New this year, we are going to have the Choraliers help 'gather' children to chapel on the second and fourth Sundays of the month, by singing the retiring procession hymn the children will all hear later in the Nave's service. We will also have the "Three Musketeers," or some of our youth, lead the Disciples Chapel on the fourth Sunday of the month.

Our emphasis in the Lambs Chapels is to familiarize the youngest with the gospel reading in a fun, relaxed (and sometimes noisy) atmosphere. Using the circle as our 'church,' we thank each child for attendance and then introduce the concept of prayer with a circle of thanks time followed by a community prayer for acceptance of the prayers of the children and good wishes for the next week.

We try in the Disciples Chapel to ready the older ones for attendance of services in the Nave by following the Revised Common Lectionary. The readings are read mostly by the children and our homilists incorporate an emphasis of a word or phrase in their homily and allow for discussion together as well. We also familiarize the children with the Nicene Creed and the Lord's Prayer.

With both our programs (formation and chapel), it is helpful to have a completed registration for each family on file. With these registrations, we can contact the parents of children, if necessary, and to be made aware of any allergies or special needs. The 2010-2011 registrations are found on the entry desk in Haden Hall or on the church website. If you

haven't already done so, please complete a new one, or verify last years and re-sign it, and leave it in the registration binder on the desk or e-mail it to childrensformation@ ghtc-kc.org.

For both the month of August and the yearto-date August, actual results were better than budgeted amounts. Income continues to exceed budget; however, user fees are somewhat below budget and pledge was higher than budget due in part to some early payment of pledge. Expenses were below budget while there is anticipated to be some increase in property expenses during the remainder of the year. For the remainder of the year the budget anticipates continued positive cashflow that remains dependent upon an increased amount of pledge, plate, and special gift income over and above the amounts received in 2009. 



















