## From the Dean Extending Summer Warmth

"Mittens!" There was always a drawer full of mittens to choose from when I was a boy. The drawer, crammed full of various sizes of woolen mittens, all the same style and color, was the combined effort of my mother and English great-grandmother. My great grandmother did her knitting throughout the year as she sat in her mother-in-law wing at my great aunt and uncle's home in Connecticut. Those red mittens came to us wrapped in tissue paper and tied with a bow every Christmas. My mother kept the red mittens darned and ready to wear with their "attach-to-coat-sleeves strings" (which we purposely lost) in the bottom drawer of a linen cabinet. The stock grew over the years. No matter how high the demand for mittens during cold and snowy weather, there was always a dry pair.

Anticipating seasons and planning ahead are traits that ensure survival and allow us to live well. Come mid-October there is an event now in the formation stages that looks ahead to winter. "Flu and Fleece" will be a day for distributing hats, scarves, and other warm items and for offering flu shots to a vulnerable community. It will be a joint outreach effort by Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral and St. Michael and All Angels Church, Mission, Kan., to be held at the Kansas City Community Kitchen. It comes about six months following our joint Maundy Thursday foot washing clinic and footwear distribution at the Community Kitchen. Some of those who participated in that event felt that there could be multiple times when we connect directly with the KCCK which began in the Cathedral Parish House basement in 1983. "Flu and Fleece" will fit that bill.

Flu, fleece and mittens come up on our screen in August because now is the time to produce and gather our resources. While work is happening to set up the flu shot side of things with the medical community, any of us can help with gathering the fleece and cold weather gear. Here's what you can do:

- Knitters: Start knitting hats, scarves, and maybe even mittens poolside in any color you want.
- Shopper: Look for deals on such items as hats, gloves, scarves, vests, sweatshirts, all kinds of fleece wear. Snap up those bargains.

There are not only mittens galore to go around, but a church capable of helping put together the means by which all have a place to live, food enough, proactive health care, and a decent place to stay warm and dry.

## Centering Prayer opportunities

Spiritual formation is writ large across the pages of Scripture ... so large, in fact, that it's often easy to miss it altogether. In C.S. Lewis's *The Silver Chair*, from *The Chronicles of Narnia*, Eustace and Jill search for a sign in a ruined city of giants, but are disheartened to find themselves wandering through a confusing maze of rock trenches without uncovering any message. The following morning, while looking out from a high window, they are astounded to see the words "UNDER ME" carved in huge letters on the stony hillside ... and they suddenly realize they had spent the previous day stumbling through the very words they had been seeking. They simply lacked the vantage point from which to read the sign.

Some of us experience the same problem when it comes to prayer. We lack the vantage point from which we pray. *Faith* and *prayer* are a journey — an experience in which we can grow beyond childlike understanding about faith and prayer into a mature understanding that prayer is interactive conversation with God and about what we and God are thinking and doing together.

The mid-twentieth-century minister and writer George Buttrick refers to prayer as "friendship with God." Author Richard Foster tells us "prayer is the key to the heart of God, the one place we truly belong."




#### Exploring and Experiencing the Naked Now: Learning to See as the Mystics See

This six week series features Thomas Keating and Betty Sue Flowers. Through this series, Fr. Keating guides us toward an understanding of the contemplative dimension of the Gospel and its extraordinary implications and applications for personal freedom and global peace.

Anyone desiring to deepen his or her prayer life will benefit from this introduction to Centering Prayer. The format will include presentation, discussions and the opportunity to practice Centering Prayer. Through DVD interviews, Betty Sue Flowers draws out of Fr. Keating the



importance of silence and contemplative practices as a means of opening the mind and heart and one's whole being to God.

As Fr. Keating states: "We are being called by God, to open to a new reality that is our True Self ... the Image and the likeness of God. This path to the True Self and all it fruits and gifts in the challenge of become fully human. And to become fully human is to become fully divine. This is the fullness of life itself, a life abiding in the grace and truth of Christ.


## CHOIR OF MEN AND BOYS OF ST. THOMAS CHURCH
