The Lessons

First Lesson: Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

Lector In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.


He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.



- Save them for a special occasion and give thanks for moms everywhere who graciously accept gifts of all kinds.

The seeds given today are Cut & Come Again Zinnias. Cut these old-fashioned blooms for your bouquets, and flowers will "come again," producing continuously until fall frost. Long-lasting 2-21/2" blossoms on heatloving plants supply endless color for your flower beds, containers and borders. Each individual flower lasts a very long time on the plant, and in the vase before fading. Zinnias seem to be a favorite of butterflies, and many gardeners add zinnias specifically to attract them.



Today's Focal St. John's Bible Illumination: "Life in Community" (Acts 4:32-35)

This illumination unites three main texts from the opening chapters of Acts: the ascension (1:6-12), Pentecost (chapter 2), and the ideal community (4:32-35). The choice of Matthias as apostle (1:15-26) appears amid this constellation of texts – an early significant action of the Jerusalem community. Crowning this community is Jesus holding a book containing his identifying name "I AM" which connects him with the Father and the Holy Spirit. Centered in the community, which is bound together by the elements of the Eucharist and the sacred Scriptures, is the Virgin Mary (representing the Church), with Peter to her right and Paul to her left (icons were not meant to be literal but reflect the theology of a passage, as Paul would not have been a communicant this early). Six apostles appear on each side of the table and beyond them anonymous saints throughout church history: men



and women, clergy and laity, from New Testament times to the present. Who do you see here? What symbols of Christian unity do you find? The call to community did not end with the early church. Where in the icon do you detect breaks in the boundaries of this circle with continuation into the margins beyond where other saints are to be found? Can you imagine the community of Grace and Holy Trinity Cathedral somewhere in this illumination?
