

THE LESSONS

First Lesson: Genesis 3:8-15

Lector Just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—"I believed, and so I spoke"—we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.



Gospeller The crowd came together again, so that Jesus and his disciples could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, "He has gone out of his mind." And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons." And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered.

"Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin" – for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit."

Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you." And he replied, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

For Communities Torn By Gun Violence

Intercessor We tell the story of homes, communities, neighborhoods, cities and town shattered by gun violence. We call the time the sacred ground around our nation that has been watered with the blood of loss and the tears of grief. We especially remember any cities and towns you wish to name here.

Grant that we may work tirelessly towards a vision where all may sit under their own vine and fig tree in safety and security. And so we pray,

For First Responders

Intercessor We stand with first responders, those who live with the horror of gun violence in service to the common good. We stand with them and their families as they heal from bearing witness to the aftermath of lives ended in violence. For Suicide & Unintentional Shootings

Intercessor We remember those who ended their lives at their own hands with a gun, those who lost their lives by unintentional shootings, and those children whose promise of life was cut short. For Those Who Feel Helpless in the Face of Gun Violence

Intercessor We stand in solidarity with those who feel helpless, dejected, or powerless in the face of the gun violence epidemic. We know that gun violence touches all cultures, classes, genders, races, tribes, and nations. We pray that we may not be overwhelmed by gun violence but that we may overwhelm the world with love. And so we pray,

For the Perpetrators of Gun Violence

Intercessor We remember the perpetrators of gun violence. We pray for their families, their friends, and those who love them. We pray for those who see no other way than violence. We pray for those who suffer from mental illness, social isolation, loneliness, and debilitating fear. Grant that we may reach out in love and transform ferocity into friendship and fear into faith. And so we pray,

For Ourselves & For Others

Intercessor We pray for ourselves and others in our lives who have been touched by gun violence. During the silent pause, we invite you to offer their names either silently or aloud.





Today's Focal St. John's Bible Illumination: "Adam and Eve" (Genesis 3:8-15)

This illumination is very complex and incorporates multiple possible focal points, some of which lay foundations for later biblical texts treating divine purpose and fulfillment. Consequently, significant restraints are imposed upon the scope of today's commentary, leaving much that will have to be explored in future essays. Possibly the best place to begin is with the gold that frames the faces of Adam and Eve. This offers a visual statement of God's role as Creator of human beings and, indeed, of all creation. Yet, there is a mysterious "messiness" in this creation – a reality expressed by the presence of the snake and the discontinuity in the gold frame. Existing as created beings amid this "messiness," Adam and Eve's painted faces convey human beings' divided but connected relationships with each other and also with their environment. These complexities, together with the colorful cloth in the background (a product of human ingenuity and effort), express the human desire to be alive and to be fruitful even while hindered by the counter-workings of unfathomable dark elements.

A portion of a mandala intimates the birth of human intellect. Mandalas periodically appear in other illuminations throughout Saint John's Bible as recurring reminders that mystery, reason, and consciousness are among the complex components of the human experience which must be confronted and somehow reconciled in our existence.

Does this portrayal of human existence inspire in you a stronger sense of gratitude, responsibility, and connectedness to God as Creator? Where do you detect elements of mystery in this visio divina? Does this illumination in any way help you in your processes of existential discernment? What are your responses to the mystery and awesomeness of existence? How do you make sense of the presence of an element of darkness as an inescapable part of human free will and reason?
